<p><b>Outstanding issues from last meeting:</b></p> <p>Some people would like to have their bread buttered – how can we have this without lots of waste?</p> <p>Seconds of pudding – how can we have seconds when there is not enough for a piece each?</p> <p>More ham in baguettes – does anyone else have any suggestions for improving baguettes?</p> <p>Bright Stars money</p>	<p>Some people suggested that a choice of buttered or unbuttered bread is put on the menu choice so that there won't be any waste.</p> <p>Others suggested buying small packets of butter so that people could put their own on.</p> <p>Suggestions were: cut each piece into quarters to share it out or have a house team or class rota for seconds choice.</p> <p>Everyone agreed that more is needed in the baguettes. Some people suggested that we occasionally have a bread sandwich or soft roll instead of a baguette.</p> <p>Some people asked if there could be a tub of salad for people to put some salad into their baguette. Could we also have an egg mayonnaise as a sandwich choice?</p> <p>Lots of good ideas were suggested as to how to spend this.</p>	<p>Miss Weston will bring all of these issues to Midday Supervisors and Mrs Potts at the next meeting.</p> <p>A whole school vote may be needed.</p>

<p>not bothering to turn up or are leaving halfway through – how can we prevent this as they are taking a space of someone who would have liked to attend.</p> <p>Some people are messing about in the lunchtime clubs are not listening to the Y6s in charge.</p> <p>How can we prevent pupils from trying to take over the running of the club from the Y6s?</p> <p>Ideas for lunchtime clubs for next year – these can be outdoors too.</p>	<p>for example: not just putting ‘games’ but instead put the type of games etc.</p> <p>Y6 to provide those taking part with a quick feedback sheet of their activity – what you enjoyed, what could be improved.</p> <p>If someone has signed up but they don’t turn up then they will get a black mark next to their name and they won’t be allowed to sign up in future.</p> <p>If anyone is messing around, not listening to the Y6s in charge or are trying to take over the club, they will not be allowed to sign up for any more clubs for the rest of the half term.</p> <p>Y6 could give out stickers for good behaviour in clubs.</p> <p>Football, dino club, den building, party games, basketball, parachute games, coding, water-colour painting, singing, film, construction, story read by Y6, dance, crafts, tennis, exercise club, maths games, skipping, computers</p>	<p>Mrs Welsh will type out a simple feedback sheet which will be kept inside the pupil voice folder. Y6 need to ensure they have enough copies (ask a member of staff to copy more if needed)</p> <p>Y6 need to ensure that they put the marks next to the sign up register and then pass this on to Miss Weston at the end of each session.</p> <p>Mrs Welsh will put a packet of stickers in the pupil voice folder.</p> <p>Next year’s Y6 pupils will use some of these ideas when running clubs from September.</p>
<p><b><u>Other issues:</u></b></p> <p>Toilet roll dispensers in the large toilets have often been left empty.</p> <p>House teams</p> <p>Running tracks are very slippery</p>	<p>Tell a member of staff if one is empty.</p> <p>Some people have said they are unfair as they are they only boy/girl in their year in that team.</p> <p>Some people have slipped on these, especially when the weather has been wet.</p>	<p>Miss Weston will ask Mrs Gibson, our school cleaner, to replace the rolls if they are nearly empty.</p> <p>Mrs Welsh has looked at the house teams list and each team has a similar amount of boys/girls in. Because we only have a small number of boys or girls in some year groups, it often means there may only be one boy/girl from a year group in that team.</p>

	There are also holes in the playground near the gate.	
<b>Lunchtime issues:</b>	<p>People are sometimes not sitting where they were told to at lunchtime.</p> <p>Some people, who are not playing football, are running across the football pitch then complaining that they have been hit with the ball.</p> <p>Sometimes the meal on that day's menu is not the one that is served that day.</p> <p>Children are playing/hiding round by the compost bin and climbing on it. This is dangerous.</p>	<p>Miss Weston will bring up these issues at the next MDS meeting.</p> <p>Teachers have spoken to their classes about their safety and about the fact that the children need to be able to see an adult.</p> <p>Miss Weston will reiterate this to MDS at the next meeting.</p>
